

Subject Line: Begin Preparing for Registration!

Dear Student,

As mentioned in our previous emails, our [First-Year Enrollment website](#) is a vital tool to help you prepare for registration, so be sure to take some time to explore the site before registration begins in July. It is important that you review the information provided by your specific college/program, including the sample schedules, to have a successful registration experience. Additionally, be sure to watch our [registration tutorial videos!](#)

As you begin preparing for registration, keep in mind that placement in some courses may depend on Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, or transfer credit you expect to receive. Lehigh expects to receive Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate scores in early July, and registration is scheduled to begin the week of July 15 to allow time to apply eligible credit to student records prior to registration. A follow up email will be sent soon, confirming your specific registration date and time.

In the meantime, it is important that you log into your [College Board](#) and/or [International Baccalaureate](#) accounts to verify that your scores are scheduled to be sent to Lehigh. Once test scores are received, we will apply eligible credit to student records. If you anticipate college transfer credit, be sure to review our [transfer credit procedures](#). You can [view your unofficial Lehigh transcript](#) to see any credit that has been applied to your Lehigh record. Please note that transfer credit evaluations may take a bit more time as they require a thorough review by our academic departments; we will continue reviewing transfer credits throughout the summer.
